



Greetings, CCC AOs and Faculty/Staff Role Users,

ASSIST Central Services is delighted to announce that the Gaps in Articulation Report has been enhanced, and access has been expanded to additional user groups!

Access Expansion

The Gaps in Articulation Report is designed to help identify opportunities to increase articulation. It was previously available only to users from 4-year institutions with an AO or Faculty/Staff role. As of last night's code push, the report is now available to all AO and report-level roles, as well as to our partners at the system offices! While access to the report has been expanded to additional user roles, the *data available is tailored to each role*. Data from this report is a critical resource for system-level and intersegmental analysis and reporting, as well as for CCC AOs researching opportunities to expand articulation to benefit their students.

Enhancements

Multiple enhancements were made to provide context across the report results, increasing the data's usability and accuracy. First, the report was enhanced to allow users to select a receiving institution. Initially, users could generate a report only for their institution, but now all users with access to the report can select any receiving institution in ASSIST and view or export the results. The Receiving Institution filter includes all four-year institutions in ASSIST.

Second, additional filters were added to further capture desired report results. 4-YR AOs and 4-YR faculty/staff report users will have access to *new filters that allow them to refine report results by locating or excluding drafted and hidden articulation for their institution*. Additionally, instances of articulation that have been denoted as draft or hidden from prefix/departments will display with a pill next to each applicable sending course.

Available filter features for 4-year AOs and 4-YR faculty/staff roles now include Academic Year, Receiving Institution, Sending Institution(s), Articulation Type(s), No Articulation Reason(s), Drafted, and Hidden dropdown options.

The third enhancement involves adding another type of articulation gap. The first iteration of the report logic relied on the No Articulation Reason(s) dropdown to pull in receiving institutions, as the presence of a No Articulation Reason(s) dropdown option indicates that articulation does not exist. However, the Articulation area includes additional functionality to identify specific courses that have been denied. The use of this functionality does indicate a course, so these instances were not included in the first version of the report. *The report logic has been updated to pull in receiving institutions' courses using the "Course(s) Denied" No Articulation Reason(s) dropdown, as well as those that display explicitly denied sending courses.* The selection or inclusion of the "Course(s) Denied" No Articulation Reason(s) filter will include all receiving institution courses in both scenarios. If a date was included when denied courses were identified, it will display with the denied course(s).

The last enhancement prevents report results from being displayed when a receiving institution has not yet rolled forward, as there is no articulation data for the selected year. A simple message is displayed in this scenario.

Accessing and Using the Report

To access the Gaps in Articulation Report, start on the *Reports* landing page, then choose the tab at the top of your screen for *Mod Articulation Reports*.

Pro tip: Select your desired academic year first, as the list of available receiving and sending institutions varies by year.

Once you have selected the academic year, begin by selecting a receiving institution. You can choose to compare articulation for multiple sending institutions or focus on a single institution. The default for all other filters is “all.” Narrow results by deselecting Sending Institution(s), Articulation Type(s), or No Articulation Reason(s). Select “View Report” and then “Export to CSV” for a download of the results. Alternatively, you can go directly to “Export to CSV” without viewing the report.
